



Directions:

1. Place flour and water in blender and process until smooth paste is formed. Pour into bowl.
2. Dip strips of newspaper into mixture.
3. Hold strip over bowl and slide fingers down the strip to remove excess liquid.
4. Spread on mold or project surface.

Tips:

- Three layers of paper-mache work best. Allow strips to dry slightly between layers. Allow finished product to dry overnight.
- Use plain newsprint or white paper towels as a final layer for a more finished look.
- While drying, smooth surface with fingers.
- When dry, sandpaper can be used to smooth out for painting.
