



• **Decorating Windows with Snowflakes**

You will need: paper, scissors, and tape

Directions: Fold the paper three times. Demonstrate to the kids how to cut notches, curves and in and out at random. Leave the edge uncut. Unfold the paper to see the snowflakes and tape to your windows.



• **Dressing a Paper Doll**



Put a paper doll on a felt board. Have snow clothes on the floor for everyone to see. Talk about getting dressed for winter play. As you talk about the different articles of clothing have your child help you dress the felt child. After he is all dressed, undress him in the order in which children would take off their snow clothes. Have the children call out the names of the clothing as you do. Encourage your child to pretend to put on his/her snow clothes.

• **What Kind of Weather?**

Brainstorm with students the type of clothing that is needed for given weather conditions. You might want to create a large semantic map to go with your discussion. Write *Weather Conditions* in the center. Have children first think of and state the conditions, then the types of clothes needed for each condition. Write their suggestions to create the semantic web.
